
Skylar Alair Thomas

- Ms. Cameron is intelligent, inquisitive, and resilient.





PBCOHE SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

A SCHOLARSHIP NOTE

PBCOHE, Inc. Scholarship Committee

The Pennsylvania Black Conference on Higher Education, Inc. will award \$1,000 scholarships to talented undergraduate and graduate African American and other underrepresented students (persons of color) in the Commonwealth. *First-semester freshman students are NOT eligible.

The scholarships and their respective criteria are herein listed:

THE K. LEROY IRVIS UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

These \$1000 scholarships will be awarded in each of the regions (Central, Eastern & Western) in Pennsylvania to undergraduate students who meet these criteria.

- Outstanding Scholarship.
- Extracurricular activity participation.
- Leadership qualities.
- Interpersonal qualities as alluded to by the student's references.
- Essay in no more than five typewritten, double-spaced pages on "Why I Should Receive a K. Leroy Irvis Scholarship."
- 3.0 or above grade point average.
- Brief bio sketch and photograph

THE W. TERRELL JONES EDUCATIONAL EQUITY SCHOLARSHIP

- ALL of the criteria listed under the K. Leroy Irvis Scholarship category, with special emphasis on the student's leadership skills and academic record, and:
- Evidence of work and/or volunteer service in the area of educational equity.
- Essay in no more than five typewritten, double-spaced pages on "Why I should receive the W. Terrell Jones Educational Equity Scholarship."

PBCOHE SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

THE ROBERT D. LYNCH LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

- ALL of the criteria listed under the K. Leroy Irvis Scholarship category, with special emphasis on the student's leadership skills and academic record, and:
- Must have attended the Robert D. Lynch Student Leadership Development Institute (SLDI).
- Essay in no more than five typewritten, double-spaced pages on "Why I should receive the Robert D. Lynch Leadership Scholarship.

THE ESTHER-JAFARI HAYMON SCHOLARSHIP

The successful recipient of this scholarship must meet the following criteria:

- Valid registration at a college or university in Pennsylvania with a financial need.
- Grade Point Average of 2.0 or above.
- Be at least in sophomore year of matriculation.
- Student must demonstrate leadership skills and participation in cocurricular activities.
- Three letters of recommendation are required. One of the three letters of recommendation MUST come from your Financial Aid Office stipulating your need.
- Essay in no more than five typewritten, double-spaced pages on "Why I Should Receive the Esther-Jafari Haymon Scholarship."
- Brief bio sketch and photograph (Photo for program booklet).

THE JOHN S. SHROPSHIRE GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

- ALL of the criteria listed under the K. Leroy Irvis Scholarship category and:
- Earned six graduate credits/hours of study (minimum)
- Essay in no more than five typewritten, double-spaced pages on "Why I Should Receive the John S. Shropshire Graduate Scholarship."

PBCOHE SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

THE JUDITH A. W. THOMAS HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

Each year, the Pennsylvania Black Conference on Higher Education (PBCOHE) will award \$1,000 scholarships to two high school seniors from high schools of the host Region for the annual PBCOHE Conference. PBCOHE will solicit scholarship applications from those schools/districts where members of the organization have active community service projects.

The school/district administrations will receive written notification of the scholarship and application process by (same date as for all PBCOHE scholarship applications).

The application process and evaluation of the Dr. Judith A. Thomas scholarship candidates will be the responsibility of a sub-committee of the PBCOHE Scholarship Committee that includes three members from the annual conference committee and two representatives from the local school district(s).

The student selection criteria are as follows:

- Student applicants must have applied and been accepted to a Pennsylvania college or university.
- Students must have a significant documented financial need. (The local school district
 members of the sub-committee will verify or document need). Student should have
 completed a FAFSA or provide verification that they completed and submitted the
 FAFSA after submitting the PBCOHE application prior to the awarding of the
 scholarship.
- Students should have at least a B average.
- Provide official high school transcript.
- The student and/or location sponsor(s) must submit an essay of no more than three 8 1/2 x 11 double-spaced typewritten pages. The essay should emphasize the following characteristics of the candidate:

Leadership Community service Personal strengths
Career goals Special talents Honors and awards

- The application must include three references reachable by telephone or e-mail.
- Student applicants should be African American or of African descent.
- The scholarship will be awarded to the student once he/she has matriculated to a Pennsylvania college or university. (The student must present proof of registration to PBCOHE secretary.)
- Scholarship award will be sent directly to the university that the student is attending.
- Student will be assigned a mentor from the PBCOHE.

K. Leroy Irvis, founder of PBCOHE. First Black Speaker of the House of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (1977). Statesman, Civil Rights Leader.



John S. Shropshire, 11th president of PBCOHE (1995-1996). Dean of Enrollment Management at Clarion University. First African American elected to a county commissioner's seat in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (1999).



Robert D. Lynch, eighth president of PBCOHE (1985-1990). Retired, Lock Haven University. Responsible for building the PBCOHE Student Leadership Development Institute (SLDI) to what it is today.



Esther-Jafari Haymon, educator. Mother of Drs. Elmer Haymon and Francene Haymon-Phillips. First chairperson of the scholarship committee.



W. Terrell Jones, 18th President of PBCOHE (2008-2010). Vice Provost for Educational Equity at Pennsylvania State University. Outstanding humanitarian. Responsible for recording the history of PBCOHE up to 2011.



Judith A. W. Thomas, sixth President of PBCOHE (1980-1982). Dean Emerita of Social Science and Behavioral Studies at Lincoln University. Former chairperson of the scholarship committee.

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
